## **Welcome to Term 1 - week 2 2019**

### **Welcome back to all members of the school community and a 'special' welcome to all of the new families who have joined us at TRBPS in 2019.**

It was lovely to see all of the very refreshed, excited and happy faces as the year 1-6 children entered the school gates last Wednesday to start their 2019 learning journey. The children went very quietly into the classrooms to meet and greet their 2019 teacher and peers. Emma and I spent Thursday and Friday visiting each classroom to welcome all of the children back to school and to chat about their holidays and expectations for the 2019 school year.

On Tuesday and Wednesday of last week, the staff spent the two days working together on OHS/Emergency Management, First Aid/CPR professional learning, team planning, preparing rooms and revision of administrative and organisational information necessary to keep a big school functioning effectively. We discussed staff roles and responsibilities, DET expectations, student wellbeing and the SSP/AIP. Teams have reviewed and prepared the start of the year 'Hit the Road Running Program' which operates in each classroom and specialist sessions for the first 2 weeks of school. This program is designed to welcome the children back to school and to set the class climate, routines and to build community. The students will be revisiting school values as well as outlining clear behavioural and learning expectations for this year with their teachers. We enjoyed a lovely staff lunch together to chat and begin the school year in a happy and positive way.

### **Compass**

It is imperative that all parents are able to log on to Compass. The portal is the major communication system and will be used for a range of applications for your children. The most recent application is the ability for us to inform parents if their child is absent. This application is an effective safety method to keep the school and parents aware of the student's whereabouts. Attendance rolls are marked by class teachers at the very beginning of the school day. It is therefore necessary for all students to be at school prior to 9am and for parents to indicate through Compass, their child's absence. All **FULL DAY** absences can be placed on the system before the school day begins. If you are arriving late after 9.00am or picking up children early you must report to office first and sign in/out. If this is not done unexplained absences will result in an SMS message being sent to parents.

If you are having trouble logging on to compass please contact the office to renew your password.

### **Hats are Compulsory- until the end of April**

The wearing of a broad brimmed hat is compulsory until the end of April. Please ensure that your child has a hat on a daily basis (regardless of early morning weather conditions). Restrictions will apply to children without a hat in regard to play, physical education and sport.

## Parents in Buildings

School policy is that parents should not enter school corridors without authorisation. Visitor badges are available from the general office to allow visits to classrooms etc. The Department of Education has asked schools to adopt strategies that assist the security of students and belongings. Your co-operation in adhering to this policy including before and after school is encouraged. As you can understand we want to make sure that your children are safe at all times.

## Lost property -Student Wellbeing - building greater responsibility and independence

To assist us in supporting students to develop resilient qualities we are requesting that all parents name each article of the school uniform for easy identification. Please ask your child to make sure any articles of clothing removed during the day are put into their school bag or their room boxes located outside of the classrooms (P-4) at each play-time. Lost property is located in cupboards outside the staff toilets in the corridor. Parents will be able to access these cupboards at the beginning and end of the school day. Please enter from the entrance adjacent to the prep area main gate to collect any articles of lost clothing. We also ask that you are mindful of keeping the cupboards neat and tidy as this area is also a walkway and we want people to be safe from possible trip hazards.

## Staff Car Park

Parents are reminded that the staff car park is for staff use only during school hours: 8.45am – 3.45pm. Any special needs requests are to be directed to the main office reception.

**Pedestrian** entry or exit through the car park gate for safety reasons is prohibited.

## Morning Drop off Zone

**No Parking – ‘Kiss and Go’ Zone - this is for quick two minute drop offs and the council are quite strict in managing this area to ensure our school community is kept safe and cars are kept moving. This allows everyone to have access to dropping their children of in a timely and safe manner.**

### No parking

A driver **must not** stop on a length of road or in an area to which a no parking sign applies, unless the driver is dropping off or picking up, passengers or goods.

**The driver cannot leave the vehicle unattended unless the driver is within three metres of the vehicle and must move on within two minutes after stopping.**

These restrictions are typically used around schools, train stations and other locations where there is a



## Use of School Crossing Student Safety – ‘safe practice’ modelling for our children

Parents are strongly encouraged to use the school crossing to provide a role model for all students - many parents have been observed crossing Tucker Road away from the crossing with younger children in hand. No students or parents should ever use the staff car park gate as a point of entry or exit - at all times avoid a mix of cars and children to safeguard our students.

## Late Arrival at School - It is NOT okay to be late

All children who arrive at school after the 9:00 am school commencement bell has gone must first report to the general office to complete a late entry notice. They should not go directly to classrooms because in many cases their class group will have commenced specialist classes e.g. Art/craft, Phys Ed, Library etc., and no children (or teacher) may be in the room. Punctuality is an important parent/child responsibility. Parents/students who are regularly late will be contacted by the school to discuss the issue. A special sitting area will be reserved for late arrivals at the Monday assembly from where they can watch the assembly and avoid class/assembly disruption. Being late regularly will impact on your child's progress and self-esteem as they feel very anxious when they have missed the start of the day and the first instructions.

## Early Collection from School

The collections of students during the day should ideally be kept to an absolute minimum. Appointments and other school activities should be made with enough leeway time to allow collection from school between 3.30 and 3.45pm. Collections between 3.00 and 3.30 often mean children miss out on notices being sent home and cause disruption to classroom learning time. General office staff also find the time very demanding when multiple early collections are being requested. If your child needs to be picked during the day, where possible please advise the teacher beforehand and pick up at beginning or end of morning recess or lunchtime.

## Collection of Children after School – Safety Concerns

Parents are reminded that children should have specific instructions as to the arrangements that are to be followed after 3:30 pm re: collection and going home. All children who are not collected by 3:45 pm will be referred to the general office.

No one should ever collect and take home other children without the specific approval of that child's parents. Each year office staff spend many hours of anxious time tracking down children where these procedures have not been followed, so we ask your co-operation in regard to this important health and safety issue.

## Out of school hours care – Camp Australia

If you know that you need to be at an early or late meeting or appointment please book your child/children into the 'Out of School Hours Care' program with **Camp Australia** through their website. They do take casual bookings. Teachers are not on yard duty until 8.45am, so this means that children dropped at school early will be in the yard alone and have **no** supervision until this time. Therefore the children will be requested to sit in specific area for their safety - if they are at school before 8.45am (unless at organised and supervised sport practice e 5/6). We prefer for the children's safety that they attend the Camp Australia out of school hours care program.

## Uniform Shop

The uniform shop will now open on **TUESDAYS (MONTHLY)** commencing Feb 5 mornings 8.30-9.30am. Orders can also be made by completing the Uniform Order Form available at the office, or purchased via the QKR App. Our uniform shop volunteers will pack your orders on a weekly basis and your items will be delivered to your child's/rens classrooms.

## Canteen

School Canteen will be open **Tuesdays** and **Thursdays**. Canteen menus are available from the general office. A Canteen Roster form was sent home via your child's classroom. If anyone can assist the canteen manager on those days, it would be very much appreciated.

## Dogs on School Grounds

Parents are reminded that dogs are not allowed in the school grounds whilst dropping off or collecting children. All dogs should be on a lead and remain **outside** school grounds at these times. This is a safety measure to protect both students (and dogs) from the excitement of these times. Arrangements can be made with class teachers for a special showing of a pet within the classroom or grounds during school time.

**NO dogs** are allowed on school grounds during school days and childcare programs 8.30-6.00pm.

## Accidents at School

Parents are reminded that the Department does not provide personal accident insurance for parents. Parents and guardians are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs.

Student accident insurance policies are available from some commercial insurers. These cover a range of medical expenses not covered by Medicare or private health insurance. Policies are reasonably low cost. **The Department of Education cannot** advise parents/guardians on whether to purchase a student accident policy or which policy to purchase.

## Cyclist Supervision/Guidelines

Any students from Year Prep to Year 3 **must be** accompanied by an adult if they ride their bike to school. Students from Year 4 to 6 are allowed to ride to school on their own provided a bicycle permission form has been returned. No student or pre-schooler of any age should ride bikes or scooters within the school grounds - bicycles and scooters need to be walked from gateways to the bike shed and vice versa. All bikes/scooters are stored in the bike storage area.

She is also a member of the Australian Government's Cybersafety working group and a published author. Her book 'Sext's Texts & Selfies', is the definitive parents' guide to helping their children stay safe online.

## PAEDIATRIC FIRST AID AND RESUSCITATION

Around 300 Australian children die each year due to accidental injuries. Many of those lives could have been saved if parents or other caregivers knew simple first aid and resuscitation skills. Paediatric first aid and resuscitation is a two hour course which can provide you with the skills to save your child's life. Developed in association with The Royal Children's Hospital Child Safety Centre and taught by ambulance paramedics, this course covers:

- care of the unconscious child;
- febrile convulsions;
- child and infant resuscitation;
- calling an ambulance; and
- management of a choking child.
