Curriculum Day August 19

This Curriculum Day was dedicated to two topics:

- DET - Cultural Understanding and Safety Training (CUST)
- DET - Victorian Teaching and Learning Model (VTLM)

All schools are required to ensure that all staff undertakes DET 'Cultural and Safety Training' within the next 2 years. It is part of the DET Marrung Strategy to ensure that all Koorie Victorians achieve their learning aspirations.

The vision is that Victoria will be a state where:

- the rich and thriving culture, knowledge and experience of our First Nations peoples are celebrated by all Victorians
- our universal service systems are inclusive, responsive and respectful of Koorie people at every stage of their learning and development journey
- every Koorie person achieves their potential, succeeds in life, and feels strong in their cultural identity.

"The Victorian Government, through the Department of Education and Training, has worked with the Victorian Koorie community to develop Marrung. The Government has listened and has heard. Marrung sets out a 10-year vision and identifies the significant actions its achievement. From this plan there will be some ground-breaking change."

Working in partnership with Koorie Victorians

Consistent with the principle of self-determination, Marrung has been developed with:

- Victorian Aboriginal Education Association Incorporated
- Victorian Aboriginal Child Care Agency
- Victorian Community Controlled Health Organisation.

Strong partnerships with these organisations and with the Koorie community will be the foundation for the implementation and governance of Marrung.

Priority Areas and Actions

To achieve its vision, Marrung encompasses actions that aim to:

1. Create a positive climate for learning and development where services demonstrate the highest levels of respect and inclusion and, as a result, Koorie children and learners of all ages feel strong in their identity within all services.
2. Build community engagement in learning and development so that, through partnership and collaboration, services work together with Koorie people to find innovative ways to improve outcomes in local communities.
3. Build a culture of professional leadership where success for Koorie Victorians is core business for all educational leaders.
4. Achieve excellence in teaching, learning and development at all stages so that:
 - young Koorie children are on track in their health, development and well-being, and their early learning experience sets them up for life
 - Koorie students engage fully throughout their schooling years and gain the knowledge and skills to excel at year 12 or its equivalent
 - Koorie learners transition successfully into further education and employment, and have opportunities to access education at all stages of life.

We all learned so much more about the Aboriginal Culture, perspectives and the timeline of indigenous history. We can't wait to continue to share all of our learning with our students and incorporate more Indigenous perspectives, culture and history into our current curriculum scope and sequence. A huge thank you to John and Eric from DET, who came to share their knowledge, culture, stories and history in a most informative and interactive presentation with the staff at TRBPS.

The DET VTLM has been introduced as a resource for schools to use that links with their School Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) and the DET Framework for Improving Student Outcomes (FISO). The Victorian teaching and learning model brings the [Framework for Improving Student Outcomes \(FISO\)](#) into the classroom. It creates a line of sight between the whole-school improvement approach and classroom practice. We talked about how we can use this model to focus on improving teaching practice in both Literacy and numeracy as the two main goals of our AIP 2019.

The model allows teachers and school leaders to:


- focus on high impact improvement initiatives,
- drive those initiatives through evidence-based decisions about their teaching and student learning.

It encourages collaboration among principals, school leaders, teachers, students and parents/carers in effective learning communities to improve learning outcomes for students.

The Victorian Teaching and Learning Model consists of four components

- A [Vision for Learning](#) helps create a unified set of values and beliefs to drive a high performance learning culture.
- The [Practice Principles](#) for excellence in teaching and learning (practice principles) are nine signature pedagogies, which make the difference in improving student achievement and motivation.
- The [Pedagogical Model](#) describes what effective teaching looks like in the classroom and helps teachers apply the practice principles; it is revised from the previous DET e5 Model.
- The [High Impact Teaching Strategies](#) (HITS), which are ten instructional practices that reliably increase student learning wherever they are applied.

A reminder that caps and sun visors are not SunSmart approved hats.

Dropping and Picking up from our school in Tucker Road and Valerie Street

As we all know it can get quite congested at drop off and pick up times in the nearby streets. I appeal to everyone to think of the **children** first and utmost, especially their 'safety'. You need to adhere to our School's Code of Conduct and the School Values during these often frustrating times. It may be a good idea whilst the weather mild and not raining to park further away and walk children to and from your car, it provides a lovely opportunity to chat about their day at school. **Please** remember that directly outside the front of the school near the pedestrian crossing on Tucker Road, is a '**Kiss and Go**' zone each morning from 8-9.30am and afternoon from 2.30 until 4pm. Please make sure you are only there for 2 minutes and stay in your car to ensure you are not penalised with a fine from the Glen Eira Council Officers. As adults we are the role models for all of the children in our community. Let's work together to ensure our children are safe at all times. Please don't call children across the road as you are double parked. Cross only at the crossings and **please** don't use the 'Staff Only Carpark' as a cut through this is **NOT** a pedestrian walk way. The walkways are marked clearly around our school by the **Yellow** markings.

Concert Information...



Tuesday 10th September 2019
Robert Blackwood Hall at Monash University, Clayton

There are several things that parents (and other visitors) need to know:

1. Robert Blackwood Hall is straight in front of the **Main Entrance** to the University (the one with the large blue and white Monash sign, Wellington Road, driving straight ahead for about 100 metres (through the roundabout) will lead to the Hall. Parking is diagonally opposite.
2. The doors of the foyer will open at 6:00pm.
3. The students performing are to be dropped off and enter through the **first** / lower foyer door where they will be greeted by a teacher and ushered to their class assembly area. We ask that the students arrive from 6pm and we expect ALL children to be in the Hall with their teacher no later than 6:45 pm.
4. Band members are asked to be at the theatre at 5.30pm for a soundcheck.
5. Once your students have been dropped off, audience members are to go to the main entrance doors (second doors along) to the upper foyer where the bar will be open. Soft drinks and snacks will available to patrons only.
6. The auditorium doors will open at 6.30pm.
7. Audience members will need to show their tickets to the ushers who will direct people to their seats.
8. The show will commence at 7:00 pm sharp.
9. The children should have all clothing, instruments, props etc. with them.
10. Please ensure your child has had their evening meal before they arrive at the venue.
- 11. TICKETS WILL NOT BE ON SALE AT ROBERT BLACKWOOD HALL.**
12. No foods or drinks are permitted in the auditorium.
13. No prams are permitted in the auditorium. There will be a pram parking bay in the foyer.
14. The show will run for approximately 2 hours with no interval.
15. At the end of the Concert, parents will remain seated for a short finale video and slide show whilst the students are marshalled to their pick up areas in the foyer.
16. The **PREP students will be waiting in the lower foyer near the first entry door at the FLINDERS (BLUE) house flag ; the YEAR 1/2s at the LAWSON (RED) flag, the Year 3/4s will be at the MELBA (YELLOW) flag around the corner in the upper foyer and the Year 5/6s will be waiting at the STURT (GREEN) flag.**
We seek your co-operation to ensure that all children are safely moved out of the Hall.
- 17. PARENTS ARE NOT PERMITTED ON STAGE, BACKSTAGE OR IN THE GREEN ROOM/WAITING AREAS.** This is due to OH&S and regulated by Monash University.
18. We are once again having the show professionally filmed. DVDs will be available for purchase.
19. Patrons must refrain from taking photographs during the performance.
20. DUE TO HEALTH & SAFETY, STANDING OR SITTING IN THE AISLES, IN THE SIDE AREAS INSIDE THE HALL OR IN THE SEATING AREA IS NOT PERMITTED.
This presents a fire hazard and blocks the view and enjoyment of others.
21. We ask for your co-operation in this matter and know that you will treat all staff with respect.
- Small children must remain seated - No running around aisles. We hire the Hall under strict guidelines and value your cooperation during the performance.




