ANZAC Commemorative Assembly - Wednesday April 24 at TRBPS

Anzac Day is one of Australia's most important National commemorative occasions. At our ANZAC assembly we stopped to reflect, respect and honour all soldiers who have fought for our country and those who have died at War. ANZAC Day is a very special day as it marks the anniversary of the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War. The **Anzac Spirit** is an idea which suggests that soldiers possess special qualities, those that were shown when they fought on the battlefields during World War I. These qualities are: endurance, courage, creativity, good humour, larrikinism and mateship. On Wednesday April 25 there were many dawn services held at War Memorials all around the world. People stopped to remember all of the many people that fought and died in the past and present wars. Diggers marched in memory of those that were lost and comrades who fought alongside them in the war. Families marched to show respect and to honour their past ancestors who fought for our country and proudly wore their medals. I would like to thank Ms Emma Baldwin and the School Student Leaders (Ellie, Angad, Ava and Rebekah) for hosting this assembly, also for their fabulous ANZAC speeches and the reading of the poems: *In Flanders Fields* by John Mc Crae and *Ode of Remembrance* from the poem *For the Fallen* by Laurence Binyon. ANZAC Day

On Wednesday 24th April the school leaders (Angad, Ellie, Ava and Rebekah) represented Tucker Road Bentleigh Primary School at the annual Bentleigh ANZAC Service. The students were accompanied by Emma and as part of the service laid a wreath to commemorate those who bravely fought for our country.

After the service the school leaders went to the RSL for morning tea where they met George Runting who is the grandfather of Georgina Runting in Prep G.

George served in the Royal Australian Air force Radar Division during World War II. He was initially stationed in Darwin and later served in Morotai and Borneo. He is pictured here with Emma and the school leaders. His many war medals include 'The Pacific Star' and the '1939-45 Star'. It was wonderful for the school leaders to meet someone directly involved who is also connected to Tucker Road Bentleigh Primary School.

TRBPS School Values

Our school values are the fundamental beliefs that represent the TRBPS school community. RESPONSIBILITY – owning our choices, actions and personal development.

Student Attitudes to School Survey for Years 4-6 – Your School, Your Say

We want our students to tell us what they think about their school:

We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and are conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of our school. The Attitudes to School Survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience.

Students from Years 4 to 6 at our school will participate in the survey over the next few weeks. Your child will complete the survey online during school hours using a purpose built secure DET online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way “testing” your child. Your child has the right to refuse or withdraw from the survey at any point during or after completion of the survey. Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used to link data for statistical and research purposes only. All responses to the survey are kept anonymous in the response file. Personal identification data will not be recorded in the survey response file. This ensures that the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.

This year the Attitudes to School survey will be conducted at our school over the period Monday 29 April to Friday June 7. The survey only takes 20 minutes to complete and occurs during your child's class time.

The survey results will be reported back to the school before the end of term 2. All survey data that is made available in reports are for groups of students only so that no individual student can be identified. Data suppression rules are used for schools with low student numbers per year level.

We will communicate the overall results in the newsletter and unpack the results with staff, students and School Council. This data is used to forward plan for the students. Last year we used the survey results to plan Inquiry units of work, inform student leaders program, SRC discussions and feedback about wellbeing, safety and facilities.

Naplan

This year the Year 3 and 5 students will be sitting the NAPLAN tests online (all tests for years 5 and three online tests for year 3 with the writing test being a pen and paper test) The NAPLAN testing period will take place between **Tuesday 14th May to Friday 24th May**. The children have been completing practise tests to become familiar with how to use the online program. The students sit four tests: Language Conventions Writing, Reading and Numeracy. In the schedule there are allocated NAPLAN catch up days should children be absent on the test days. Testing is usually during the first session of each day so it is important students are at school on time. If you have any questions about this year's NAPLAN testing, please contact the NAPLAN coordinator's Ms Karen Baxter (Year 3) and Ms Denise Van Cuylenburg (Year 5) or Ms Emma Baldwin (Assistant Principal). Information regarding NAPLAN testing was sent out via a letter on Compass late last term. More reminders will be included in the next newsletter.

The classrooms will be open from 6.30-7.30pm, this is a wonderful opportunity to see what the children do in Mathematics sessions across the school. Please come along and enjoy the various Mathematics games and complete the activities that will be set up in each year level across the school P-6.

Please also ensure you make time to wonder around the Library block to view the great Visual Arts displays, visit the Italian room and see the videos of musical performances.

Staff will be using the carpark to ensure that there is more available street parking for parents/carers. I have been part of this school community since 2010 when our eldest child Sachi (now in Year7) started at Tucker Road Bentleigh PS, and our son Felix is currently in Year 4. Over the last 8 years, I have seen this school go from strength to strength and I am very honoured to represent our school community on Council.

One of the biggest challenges we face as a school community is how to ensure very busy parents can continue to be engaged in school life and support the work of the school. As we all know, schools never seem to have enough resources to do all the amazing things required to ensure our children receive a well-rounded education. This is where the support of parents plays a vital role. **Camps, Sports and
Excursions Fund**

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student misses out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their achievements.

CSEF will be provided to eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

Illness

It can be difficult for families to know when their child is sick enough to need to stay home from school. For safety's sake, if your child seems unwell you should always keep them home from school and seek medical advice.

Clearly we want children to be resilient and learn to put up with minor health matters, however it is important that students do not return to school before they are completely over illness. Apart from the fact that our facilities are limited it is problematic if children return to school too soon and infect others.

Families can experience problems when trying to take time off to care for an ill child at home. However, it is important that parents focus not only on the wellbeing of their own child, but also upon the wellbeing of other children and the staff.

If you have to administer Panadol before school – then your child isn't school ready.

Antibiotics that are to be administered three times per day can be done at home. The first dose can be administered between 7am – 8.30am, the following dose can be administered between 3.45 – 4.30pm. Then the last dose can be given at 8pm or before bed.

If your child has a temperature, has vomited or had diarrhoea, they must be completely well for 24 hours before returning to school.
