Student Attitudes to School Survey for Years 4-6 – Your School, Your Say!

Students from Years 4 to 6 at our school have completed the Attitudes to School Survey over the last few weeks. They completed the survey online during school hours using a purpose built secure DET online survey tool. All responses to the survey are kept anonymous in the response file. Personal identification data will not be recorded in the survey response file. This ensures that the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times.

The survey results will be reported back to the school early next term. All survey data that is made available in reports are for groups of students only so that no individual student can be identified. We will communicate the overall results in the newsletter and unpack the results with staff, students and School Council. This data is used to forward plan for the students. Last year we used the survey results to plan Inquiry units of work, inform the student leaders program, SRC discussions and feedback about wellbeing, safety and facilities.

Student Assessment, Report Writing and Reporting to Parents/Carers Process

Teachers have assessed student capabilities in all curriculum areas and prepared written reports on each child. Assessment is the ongoing process of gathering, analysing and reflecting on evidence to make informed and consistent judgements to improve future student learning. Assessment for improved student learning and deep understanding requires a range of assessment practices to be used with three overarching purposes:

- * Assessment FOR learning - occurs when teachers use inferences about student progress to inform their teaching
- * Assessment AS learning - occurs when students reflect on and monitor their progress to inform their future learning goals
- * Assessment OF learning - occurs when teachers use evidence of student learning to make judgements

The primary purpose of assessment is to improve student performance. Good assessment is based on a vision of the kind of learning we most value for students and how they might best achieve these. It sets out to measure what matters most. Assessment is most effective when it reflects the fact that learning is a complex process that is multi-dimensional, integrated and revealed in student performance over time. **Assessment methods used should be valid, reliable and consistent.** Assessment tools and processes are chosen which directly measure student outcomes in specific areas of the curriculum. They include moderation between teachers to enhance objectivity and contribute to a shared understanding of the judgments that are made. Over the last few weeks the teachers have worked in professional learning teams to moderate student's writing to assist them in forming 'consistent' judgements across the level. Information about the outcomes students have achieved is very important. We assess at the start of a unit of work to know where children are at in that particular point in time and assess again at the end to know where they are right now on the learning continuum. However we need to remember that documenting the learning journey along the way is just as important.

In the Prep (Foundation) to Year 2 we have incorporated the use of, 'I can' statements. These were used last year and the feedback was that they were very reader friendly. We are always looking for ways to improve our school reports so if you have any feedback about the changes please see Mrs Lucy McNair or Mrs Lisa Atto (Team Leaders of P and 1&2) early next term.

Reporting is the process by which assessment information is communicated to parents about what students know and can do, together with recommendations for their future learning. It has been an exciting and busy term for everyone.

Teachers are finalising their assessments and reports of student learning and it is expected that these will go live via Compass after 4pm Wednesday June 26. Parent/carer and teacher discussions will take place week 2 of Term 3. The booking detail and other information regarding these meetings will be available to parents/carers shortly. There will be appointments times available From Monday to Thursday (July 22 to July 25) before and after school, as well as the Wednesday evening until 7.45pm. This will provide an opportunity for some evening appointments.


School Walkathon 2019

Principal's Conference - June 2019

During the first week of June, Emma and I attended the State Principal's Conference for two days in at the Convention Centre at Southbank. The International guest speakers were absolutely amazing. We were able to attend workshops with innovative academics in educational research from around the world who spoke about best practice in leadership, school culture, rigour and most importantly improving student outcomes. A highlight of the conference was listening to Professor John Hattie. He is internationally acclaimed for his research in education, including the field of assessment and evaluation. His research interests include performance indicators, models of measurement, and evaluation of teaching and learning. John Hattie's presentation focused on what truly makes a difference to the learning of students. He talked about how as school leaders we can ensure that what is happening within our schools is having a difference to the learning outcomes for all students. We were also able to see Dr Barbara Blackburn. She is ranked number 5 in the Top 30 Global Gurus in Education in the US and is passionate about raising the level of rigor and motivation for professional educators and students. Her insightful presentation provided information around exactly what true rigor is and how school leaders and teachers alike, can ensure students are continually improving and being challenged. Barbara also spoke about the importance of celebrating mistakes as these provide an authentic opportunity for students to not only learn but to also become less fearful of taking risks in their classroom.

A Yard Environment Update - Fantastic Without Plastic!

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student misses out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their achievements.

CSEF will be provided to eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students
