To create and maintain a child safe organisation, an early childhood service must have in place:

- Standard 1: Strategies to embed an organisational culture of child safety, including through effective leadership arrangements
- Standard 2: A child safe policy or statement of commitment to child safety
- Standard 3: A code of conduct that establishes clear expectations for appropriate behaviour with children
- Standard 4: Screening, supervision, training and other human resources practices that reduce the risk of child abuse by new and existing personnel
- Standard 5: Processes for responding to and reporting suspected child abuse
- Standard 6: Strategies to identify and reduce or remove risks of child abuse
- Standard 7: Strategies to promote the participation and empowerment of children.

School Council and the Child Safe Standards

At the last School Council meeting I reported on the upcoming school review process and the importance of the Child Safe Standards. I presented about our responsibilities as a SC in ensuring we work to provide a safe, healthy, inclusive and caring environment for all students. All of the Child Safe Standards (CSS) Policies and Processes have been reviewed and as part of the school review process and have been uploaded to the school website: www.tucker-road.vic.edu.au

This SC meeting, I am providing members with the TRBPS Statement of Values (code of conduct for the school community), Statement of Values and Philosophy, TRBPS CSS Risk Analysis Plan and the TRBPS CSS Policy. Hopefully you have all noticed our refurbished noticeboards in the administration corridor and office area where we are proudly displaying all of our important documents related to building school community and ensuring a safe and inclusive environment for the whole TRBPS school community. There are many other policies that we have worked on as part of this school review process to revise or new policies to create for the VRQA process (for school registration) as part of the school review.

TRBPS School Values and Philosophy Statement presented with the newsletter

The School Statement of Values and Philosophy incorporates our School Values:

FRIENDLINESS – being kind, welcoming, and inclusive to everyone.

ENTHUSIASM – striving to be the best by having high expectations, confidence and a positive attitude

RESPONSIBILITY – owning our choices, actions and personal development.

This document also outlines the way in which we would like everyone in the community to interact. It also includes our Educational Philosophy from the school website.

The School Review Process and Parents/Carers having a 'SAY' in our School!

As part of process of reviewing the School Strategic Plan (2015-2018) we have reviewed the school processes, procedures, policies, programs, facilities and community events to ascertain: What should we continue doing? What should we start doing? What should we stop doing? This included the staff, families and the students.

As part of the school review process we conducted school community forums and an online survey based around the 3 questions. Thank you to all of the families who completed the survey, I believe we had around 180 responses from around 450 families at the school. Although we didn't have a high number of family members attend the morning or after school forums, we still maintained the discussion and collated some great feedback. Thank you to the parents/carers who did attend the forums, your feedback will all form part of the information to guide the review documentation and the next School Strategic Plan. The data from all forum groups was very similar across the board. Genevieve and I will present this back to School Council through the Pre Review Self Evaluation document and on the Validation Day to the panel in late August when all of the collected information has been finalised and uploaded to DET ready for sharing. We will feed back further information to the school community at the conclusion of that process in early September. Thank you to Mr David Anderson (educational consultant) who facilitated all of the forums. He spoke very highly about the 'wonderful friendly and welcoming community we have at TRBPS'. His parting words were, 'that this is a great tribute to the school'.

STATEMENT OF VALUES

Tucker Road Bentleigh Primary School recognises the importance of the partnership between schools and parents to support student learning, engagement and wellbeing. We share a commitment to, and a responsibility for, ensuring inclusive, safe and orderly environments for children and young people.

This Statement of Values sets out our behavioural expectations of all members in this school community, including the principal, all school staff, parents, students and visitors. It respects the diversity of individuals in our school community and addresses the shared responsibilities of all members in building safe and respectful school communities.

Discrimination, sexual and other forms of harassment, bullying, violence, aggression and threatening behaviour are unacceptable and will not be tolerated in this school.

Our Statement of Values acknowledges that parents and school staff are strongly motivated to do their best for every child. Everyone has the right to differing opinions and views and to raise concerns, as long as we do this respectfully as a community working together.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Respond appropriately when inclusive, safe or orderly behaviour is not demonstrated and implement appropriate interventions and sanctions when required.
- Make known to parents the school's communication and complaints procedures.
- Ask any person who is acting in an offensive or disorderly way to leave the school grounds.

AS TEACHERS AND ALL NON-TEACHING STAFF, WE WILL:

- Model positive behaviour to students consistent with the standards of our profession.
- Proactively engage with parents about student outcomes.
- Work with parents to understand the needs of each student and, where necessary, adapt the learning environment accordingly.
- Work collaboratively with parents to improve learning and wellbeing outcomes for students with additional needs.
- Communicate with the principal and school leaders in the event we anticipate or face any tension or challenging behaviours from parents.
- Treat all members of the school community with respect.

AS PARENTS, WE WILL:

- Ensure our child attends school on time, every day the school is open for instruction.
- Take an interest in our child's school and learning.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student misses out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their achievements.

CSEF will be provided to eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

SCHOOL COUNCIL REPORT

Hello families, can you believe we are halfway through the school year! We had a big School Council meeting last night with updates on the school review, the child safe policy along with some other policies.

The PFA, as always are doing an amazing job raising much needed funds for the new gym and bringing the community together through important events like the Movie Day, Mother's Day stall and their integral assistance for events like the grandparents day. It was also great to hear of the essential work the Buildings and Grounds (BaGS) sub-Committee have been doing with the gym project. They are also looking into some new soccer goals for the oval and making our school more energy efficient with LED lighting.

I think it's important to note that the funds supplied for the new gym are for the building only. The second half of this year will see us move into major fundraising mode so we can add in things like a sounds system, audio visual equipment, heating, cooling and landscaping.

We have also been working through all the fantastic responses to our student and community feedback forums. We had over 160 responses to the online form and are starting to see some clear patterns emerging from the data. It was also interesting to see that there were similar things raised across all of the forums. I'll give you more information on that in the next newsletter.

Finally, Robyn and I have had a follow up meeting with Camp Australia. They are keen to continue improvements to the centre and will be making further investments into the facilities, staffing and improving the program.



IMPORTANT Notice to Parents

28th May 2018

Notifying parents of an unexplained student absence

Commencing Term 3, 2018 all government schools have an obligation to inform parents if their child is absent from school as soon as practicable on the day of absence. Tucker Road Bentleigh, Primary School has chosen to notify parents using the Compass portal. It is therefore important that you familiarise yourself with this application if you haven't already done so. If you know that your child is going to be away from school on any given day we ask that you enter the absence on Compass.

You are legally required to ensure your child attends school every day or you must provide an explanation for their absence. You should let the school know in advance of any upcoming absences or let us know in the morning if your child won't be at school. In order for TRBPS to implement the same day notification requirement, it's essential that you provide the school with your most up-to-date contact details.

Unexplained student absence notifications are a chance for us to work together to ensure that we know where students are at all times. If you receive a notification that your child has been recorded as absent and you believe them to be at school, please call the office immediately so that we can work together to ascertain exactly where they are at that present time. We want this to be a partnership in looking after the wellbeing and attendance of your child and not a chance for criticism.






